Board Items

(Meetings of February 17 and March 10, 2009)

Tax Grievance Day Tax Grievance Day will be April 21, 2009.

Budgeting Village Trustees and Commissioners are reducing expenses as much as possible as they plan budget expenditures for both the remainder of this year and next year. The remainder of last year's grant money has been received as re-imbursement for roadwork expenditures

Recreation Commissioner A. Pijacki reported that the clay tennis courts are expected to be completed soon and the hedges replaced. Work on the berm to protect the hard courts from storm water run off is also to be completed shortly. The Board approved up to \$6000 to cover this work after accepting the lowest bids.

Hazard Mitigation Resolution The Board approved a resolution adopting the Suffolk County Multi Jurisdictional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. The Village is one of the jurisdictions.

Landscaping Mayor Klatsky and Trustee Willen met with J. Varisano of Priority Landscaping. They agreed on measures to improve communication and to gain greater control of landscaping expenditures for the Village.

The Board accepted the bid of Carla Caruso of Pots and Petals for garden landscaping at the Village Hall and for the barrels and gardens maintained by the Village.

Village Hall Rentals The Board approved Village Hall rentals for March 27, April 4, April 17, April 19, May 2, May 9, June 5, June 20, July 12, and July 18, 2009. The Boy Scouts were given permission to use the beach on June 11, 2009.

Energy Audit Trustees Weiss and Falco, Village Hall Commissioner Scrimenti, and Assemblyman Alessi met with representatives if LIPA, NYPA and NYSERDA (Energy Research) in discussions that began with the need for back-up power at the Village Hall. The consultants recommended a gas powered generator but that alternative energy sources also be explored. The first step, no matter what choices are made, is to undertake an energy audit of the Village Hall. This will be done in the near future. The Village thanks Assemblyman Alessi for making this meeting possible.

Security Police Commissioner Flannery proposed rescheduling security presence in the Village during more daylight hours. He also alerted the Board to the age of the Village patrol car. This will be investigated.
