On July 15, 1916 the Shoreham Country Club was founded with the express purpose of the promotion of social intercourse of its members and the families of its members, and to provide therefore suitable recreation and entertainment, and particularly to encourage a friendly community spirit; also to provide for the establishment and maintenance of a place or places for social meetings and recreation.

Although the founders of the Shoreham County Club are long gone, I think they would be proud and pleased that their vision has continued unabated for almost ninety-five years.

My personal introduction to the Village and the Shoreham Country Club occurred in June of 1968 when I was seven years of age. We had come to Shoreham for our first summer, and what a terrific summer it was!

During the 1960s and 70s, "The Club" provided us children with countless fun-filled summer activities such as softball games, foot races, water-melon wrestling, water balloon fights, overnight hikes, dance lessons, summer play productions, trips to Shea Stadium and dozens of other activities

which kept us kids out of trouble - and out of our parents hair!

For our parents, grandparents and great grandparents' generations, the Shoreham Country Club served an identical function - albeit on a slightly more adult level. For the adults, "The Club" hosted formal dinner-dances, cocktail parties, talent competitions, and a host of other fun adult activities for summer after summer, year after year.

The Club's adult traditions continue in virtually unaltered form to this day.

The Shoreham Country Club has gotten off to a terrific start in 2011. We organized two very successful TGIF events utilizing the Village Hall, the Academy Awards Brunch, and the St. Patrick's Day Dinner Dance. All were well attended and received.

We have a litany of events scheduled for the summer including the Memorial Day Cocktail Party, the July 4 Dinner Dance, the Family Beach Party, the Clambake, The August Brunch, and the Labor Day Dinner Dance. It should be a great summer!
