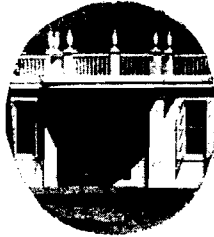

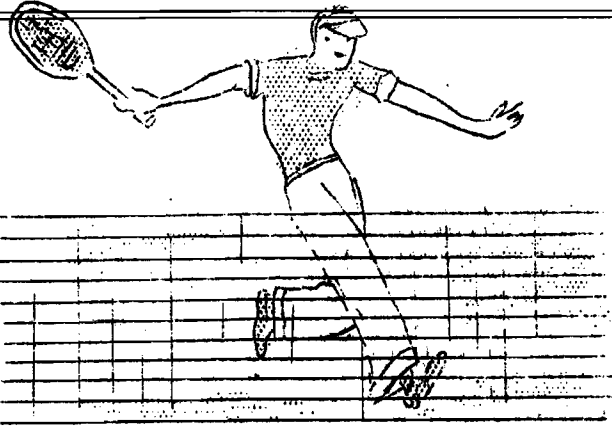

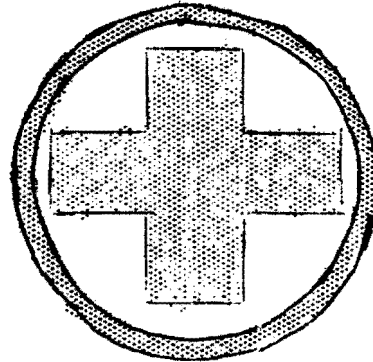


Last Sunday Mr. Oliver led the Sunday Evening Song Service and Mrs. Drayton Belknap played the piano.

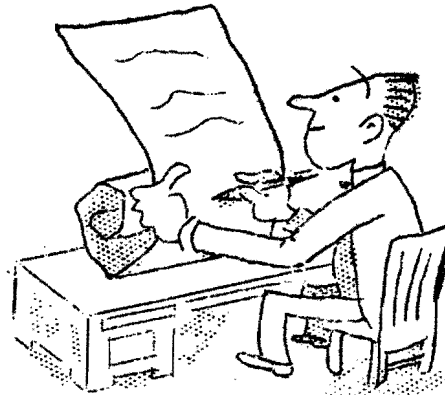

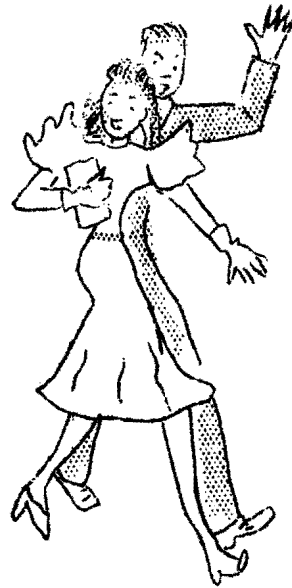

Next Wednesday Nite will be headress night. Everyone-boy or girl- must wear something on his or her hair in order to be admitted.

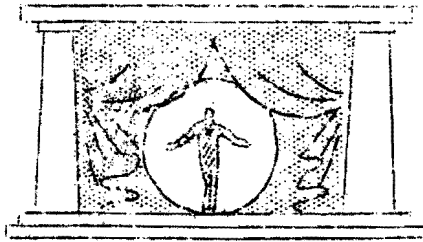

## The Shoreham Jitney Players

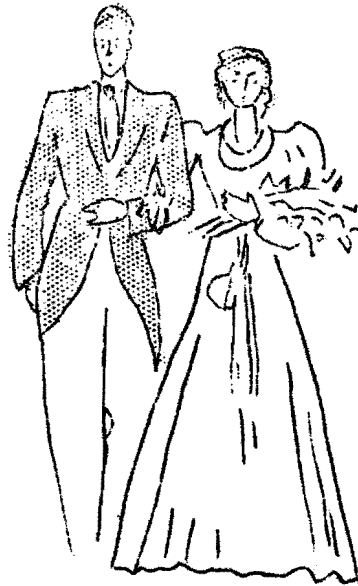
